interprofessional teams of health and social care professionals encounter and respond to significant ethical challenges and complexity in their everyday work this scenario based book explores how to enact ethical values and virtues while working across the four pillars of professional activity practice education leadership and research effective responses to care needs and everyday complexity require teamwork and a holistic approach to individual family and community needs they require health and social care professionals having an in depth appreciation of their own professional roles responsibilities and contributions as well as those of other professions this book enables readers to engage with and reflect on a range of ethical decision making situations that can occur across the lifecourse and impact interprofessional teams each chapter is based around particular authentic scenarios derived from the experiences of care recipients and family members involved in the co production of the book and taking place in a range of care contexts from maternity care to community from hospital to residential care and from accident and emergency areas to hospice introducing and discussing interprofessional issues from an ethical stance this is an essential text for health and social care students and practitioners and a resource for interprofessional ipe facilitators with a commitment to ethics in health and social care practice research education and leadership

this accessible text presents a comparative analysis of health and social care policy and practice from around the world with learning points drawn out for the uk it supports readers to improve practice by reflecting on differences and similarities in the policies of other oecd countries divided into two parts the book opens with a focus on core concepts in health and social care policy and practice such as service user involvement the promotion of wellbeing health inequalities funding and integrated care the differing philosophical socio political and historical perspectives that underpin these key areas in different countries are explored in order to develop a greater understanding of the uk system the second part of the book takes a close look at a range of specific contemporary issues such as end of life care long term conditions homelessness refugee and migrant health disability domestic abuse substance use and women in prison these in depth case study chapters enable readers to identify best practices and challenges in relation to specific areas of health and social care policy and practice ideal for undergraduate students studying health and social care policy from a range of disciplinary backgrounds this practical text provides a deeper understanding of complex health and social care issues and supports the development of a global and comparative skill set

neoliberal political discourses have normalised the belief in northern european countries that individuals are responsible for their health and wellbeing regardless of social class gender or ethnic background drawing on examples from germany sweden and the uk simmonds critically examines how the neoliberalisation and marketisation of health and social care have created an adverse environment for older people who lack social and cultural capital to access the care they need this crucial analysis scrutinises provision for ageing populations on an individual national and global level challenging current political and social policy approaches this rigorous text discusses innovative solutions to contemporary challenges in a complex care system

the way we communicate with people matters and the way we communicate about people and about the purpose and practice of social care and social work matters too the words we use reflect our values and feelings which influences the way we think and

behave this is a book about language and how the words we hear read and choose to use both expose and perpetuate attitudes and behaviours it s about the words that are too dominant in our narrative and practice and the words that should dominate it s also a book about change changing how we communicate about people changing how we understand and articulate the purpose of social care changing how we practice and ultimately changing the story of social care and mainly it s a book about being human about recognising each other as equal valued human beings and about creating a more human humane future for us all

in exploring the development of a human rights based approach to social care smith challenges the perception of human rights law and practice being the preserve of lawyers and demystifies human rights in a social care context

this text looks at partnership in human services between the different professional groups delivering health and social care to a broad range of client groups each chapter focuses on how the challenges of partnership work can be overcome and this is supported by examples from practice and research
